Organized Research includes federal clinical trials.

- * Off-campus OR that is located within commuting distance (defined as 50 miles) to the University is 27.1%. (Referred to as Off-campus, Adjacent)
- * Off-campus OR that is located beyond commuting distance to the University is 26.00%.
- Off-campus OSA and SI is 26.00% for all locations.

OTHER SPONSORED ACTIVITIES involve the performance of service or demonstrative activities not defined as Organized Research or Instruction. Examples of such activities include health service projects, community service programs, technical testing and product evaluations that are not clinical trials.

SPONSORED INSTRUCTION is instructional or training activity established by grant, contract, or cooperative agreement that is not considered to be Research Training.

INDUSTRY/FOR PROFIT rates effective for all new projects as of Feb. 1, 2007. These rates will be reviewed and possibly updated each year.

INDUSTRY/FOR PROFIT CLINICAL TRIALS - A study designed to assess the safety and/or efficacy of drugs, devices, treatments or preventive measures in humans.

TDC (Total Direct Costs) includes expenses that are excluded from MTDC (Modified Total Direct Costs) such as capital equipment, charges for patient care, and costs of subcontracts in excess of \$25,000.

OFF-CAMPUS is defined as a project or part of a project where the activity is conducted in leased space that is charged directly to the project. If the project is not directly charged for the lease cost and the lease is part of the F&A rate, then the project is considered On-Campus.

ALL PROPOSALS must provide for full Indirect Cost (F&A) Recovery at the appropriate rate as noted in the above schedule.

TREATMENT OF FRINGE BENEFITS:

Fringe benefits are specifically identified to each employee and are charged individually as direct costs. The directly claimed fringe benefits are listed below.

TREATMENT OF PAID ABSENCES:

Vacation, holiday, sick leave pay and other paid absences are included in salaries and wages and are claimed on grants, contracts and other agreements as part of the normal cost for salaries and wages. Separate claims are not made for the costs of these paid absences.

OFF-CAMPUS DEFINITION: For all activities performed in facilities not owned by the institution and to which rent is directly allocated to the project(s), the off-campus rate will apply. SECTION III: GENERAL

A. LIMITATIONS:

The rates in this Agreement are subject to any statutory or administrative limitations and apply to a given grant, contract or other agreement only to the extent that funds are available. Acceptance of the rates is subject to the following conditions:

(1) only costs incurred by the organization were included in its facilities and administrative cost pools as finally accepted: such costs are legal obligations of the organization and are allowable under the governing cost principles; (2) The same costs that have been treated as facilities and administrative costs are not claimed as direct costs; (3) similar types of costs have been accorded consistent accounting treatment; and (4) The information provided by the organization which was used to establish the rates is not later found to be materially incomplete or inaccurate by the Federal Government. In such situations the rate(s) would be subject to renegotiation at the discretion of the Federal Government.

B. ACCOUNTING CHANGES:

This Agreement is based on the accounting system purported by the organization to be in effect during the Agreement period. Changes to the method of accounting for costs which affect the amount of reimbursement resulting from the use of this Agreement require prior approval of the authorized representative of the cognizant agency. Such changes include, but are not limited to, changes in the charging of a particular type of cost from facilities and administrative to direct. Failure to obtain approval may result in cost disallowances.

C. FIXED RATES:

If a fixed rate is in this Agreement, it is based on an estimate of the costs for the period covered by the rate. When the actual costs for this period are determined, an adjustment will be made to a rate of a future year(s) to compensate for the difference between the costs used to establish the fixed rate and actual costs.

D. USE BY OTHER FEDERAL AGENCIES:

The rates in this Agreement were approved in accordance with the authority in Office of Management and Budget Circular A-21 Circular, and should be applied to grants, contracts and other agreements covered by this Circular, subject to any limitations in A above. The organization may provide copies of the Agreement to other Federal Agencies to give them early notification of the Agreement.

E. OTHER:
