

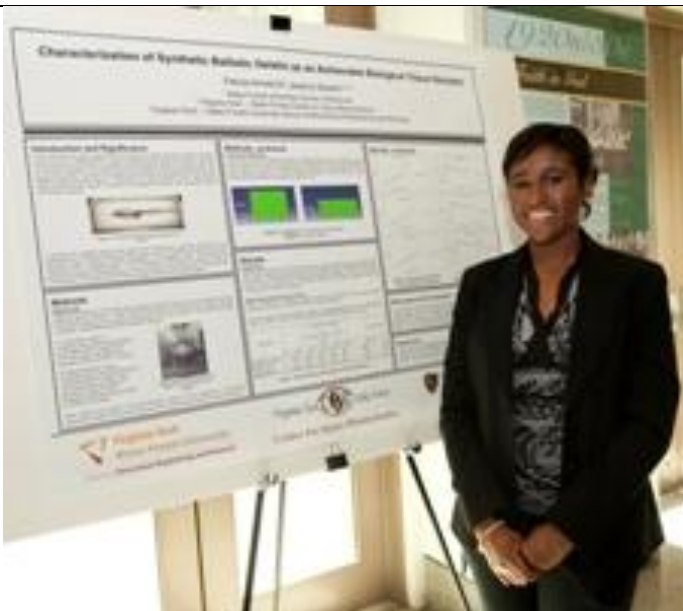

The PREP Scholars Poster Presentation began at 9 am on June 7, 2010 with symposium to follow.



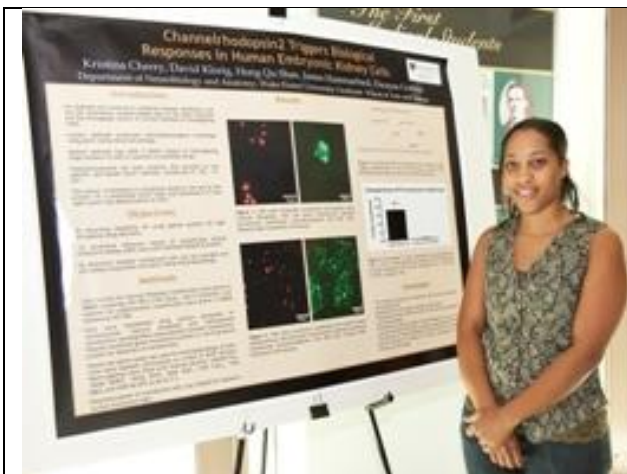

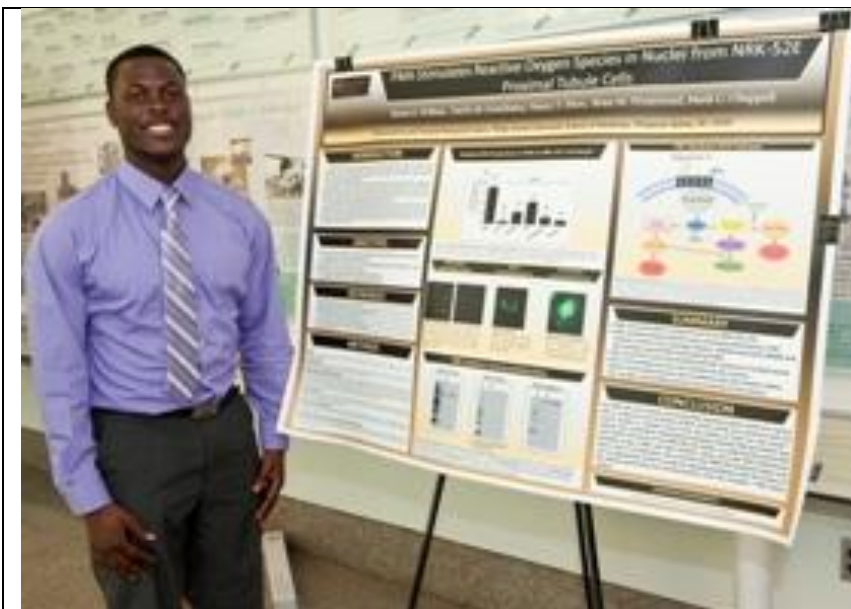

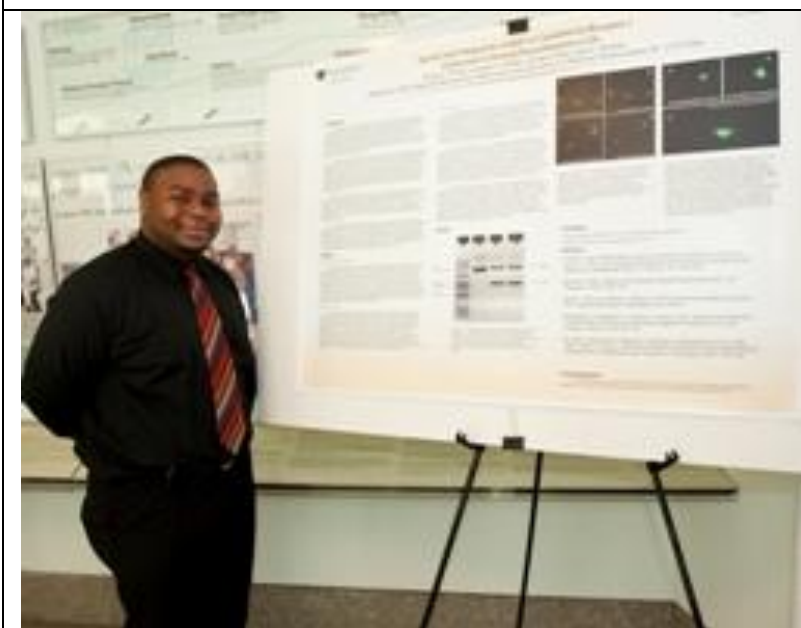

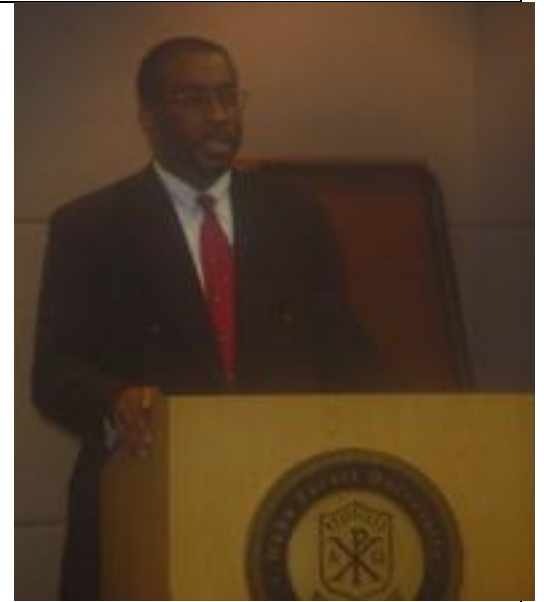

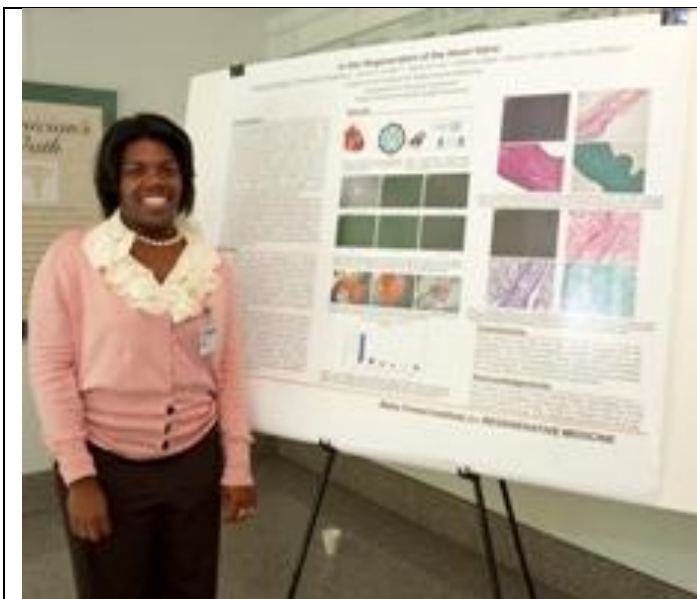
