Off-Campus Access and CME Credit

UpToDate is now available off-campus through the library's homepage. Previous access was on-campus only. Use your wfubmc login and password when prompted.

Clinicians' accessing *UpToDate* through Centricity and Carecast can earn .5 AMA PRA Category 1 continuing education credit for each topic searched in UpToDate. To earn CME/CE contact hours, you must access UpToDate through the patient record and you must register with UpToDate. From Centricity, use the "Lookup Problems" drop-down selection for UpToDate. In Carecast, use the UpToDate button in the lower right of the base screen.

Several other types of CME credit are also available. Credit is accrued automatically. To see how many credits you have earned, select CME from the navigation bar in UpToDate. You may process your credits online and print your certificate at any time.

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CME Credits through MD Consult

CME

MD Consult offers continuing medical education credits through the Cleveland Clinic Center for Continuing Education. Physicians may earn 0.5 AMA PRA category 1 credits for each search conducted. After completing your search, click on one or more of the citations found and then click on the “Request CME” icon that will appear above the resource’s title. Another window will open at the Cleveland Clinic site. Fill out a questionnaire and submit electronically to receive your credit.

Neofax: New Module available from Micromedex 2.0

The library recently purchased NeoFax, a module of Micromedex 2.0 that is designed to help clinicians accurately prescribe, calculate, formulate, and administer essential drugs and parenteral nutrition solutions for infants. By providing complete neonatal drug information covering more than 180 substances, NeoFax helps reduce medication errors and decreases time spent ordering and compounding.
