The Medical School Bookstore in the Carpenter Library merged into *University Stores of Wake Forest University*.

Textbooks, medical books, medical equipment and other items previously sold through our bookstore can now be purchased online at www.wfustores.com/t-medschool.aspx.

The “virtual” bookstore offers additional textbook choices for students, including new, used, rental and loose leaf editions, with the ability to compare prices online. Items can be shipped directly to students, faculty, and staff who order from the University Bookstore website. Additionally, departments can place orders with University Bookstores and then pick them up in the Library. Dorothy Carpenter Howard Bust Creation



A Work in Progress



Going through physical exhibits, Dorothy Carpenter Archives staff found photographs taken during the creation of Mrs. Dorothy Carpenter Howard's bust. The bust, which is housed in the Archives, was created by Earline Heath King. Mrs. King created several fine art pieces for Wake Forest Baptist Health, including Bowman Gray's statue at Alumni Plaza.

The sequence of 14 photographs was taken in 1992 by photographers in Biomedical Communications, now Creative Communications. The Archives provided photographs of Mrs. Carpenter for the project. Mrs. Carpenter posed for Mrs. King during the

creation of the bust. Photographs of the work on the bust depict the shaping of the face, neck and ears; creation of the scarf around Mrs. Carpenter's neck, and creation of the base.

Mrs. Carpenter was the wife of the founding dean, Coy C. Carpenter, M.D., of Bowman Gray School of Medicine (now Wake Forest School of Medicine).

Notary Public

Service in the Library

The Library offers notary public services during limited hours. Please call the Information Desk at 713-7100 or 716-4414 before you come to the Library to ensure that a notary will be available to assist you when you arrive.

- Documents are required to have a Notary Certificate on them – this is the wording about the notary signature, dates, and other information.

Here are some important things to remember:

- Do not sign your document before you meet with the Notary Public.
- Please bring a photo id with you.
- If more than one person needs to sign, they must come with you.
- We can only notarize documents in English. All foreign language documents must be translated into English before notarization.
