

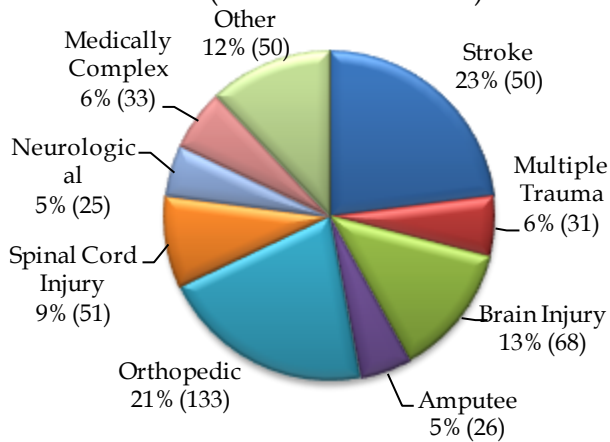
FAST FACTS

Comprehensive Inpatient Rehabilitation Program

The Comprehensive Inpatient Rehabilitation Program at Wake Forest Baptist Health serves patients age 13 and older needing comprehensive and intensive rehabilitation. Patients benefit from the expertise of our rehabilitation team and intensive training for patients, families and caregivers. An individualized care plan is developed for each patient based on the goals of each patient and family. Patients participate in at least three hours of therapy each day. The following information describes the types of patients this Program serves and the Program's clinical and patient satisfaction outcomes.

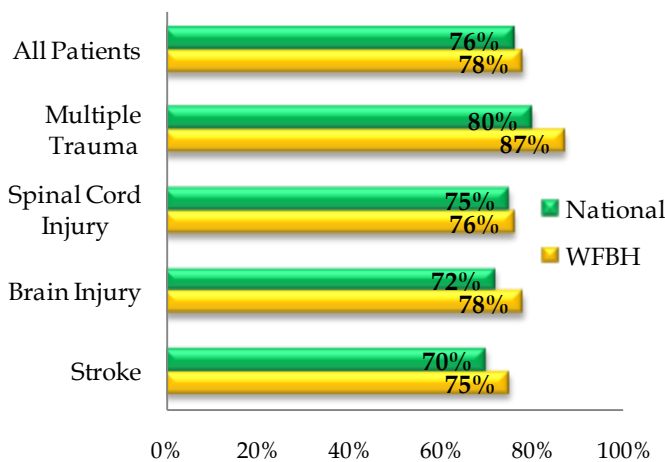

The WFBH Inpatient Rehab Program serves over 500 patients annually with a wide variety of conditions.

The average length of stay for an Inpatient Rehab patient at WFBH is 17 days, but varies by diagnosis.

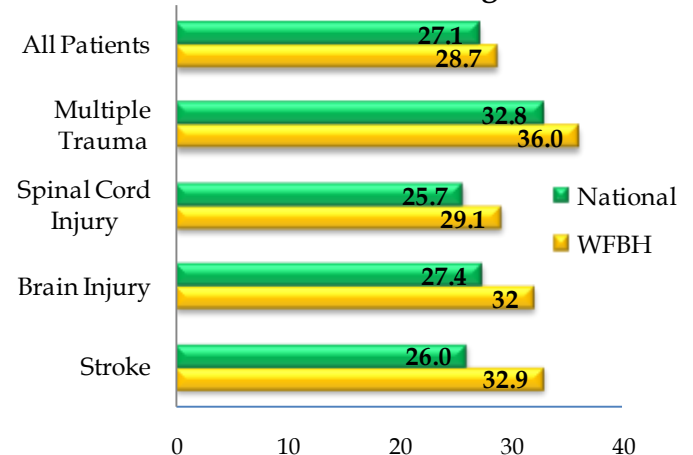
Patient Outcomes

2010 Percent Discharged to Home or Community



The ability to return to home or community is a key outcome of Rehabilitation. The WFBH Rehab Program discharges more patients to home than other facilities nationwide.

2010 Functional Independence Measure (FIM) Change from Admission to Discharge



Patients in the WFBH Rehab Program achieve higher functional gains than patients in other rehab facilities nationwide. During 2010, 74% of WFBH Rehab patients achieved their personalized functional improvement goals.

Patient Satisfaction

The WFBH Rehabilitation Program uses the Press Ganey survey tool to measure patient satisfaction. In 2010, the WFBH Rehabilitation Program's patient satisfaction was better than 92 percent of facilities that use Press Ganey. Below is a sample of survey items and results for 2010.

How well therapy staff helped you meet goals	94%
Overall Assessment	94%
How well staff worked together	95%
