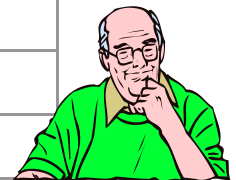

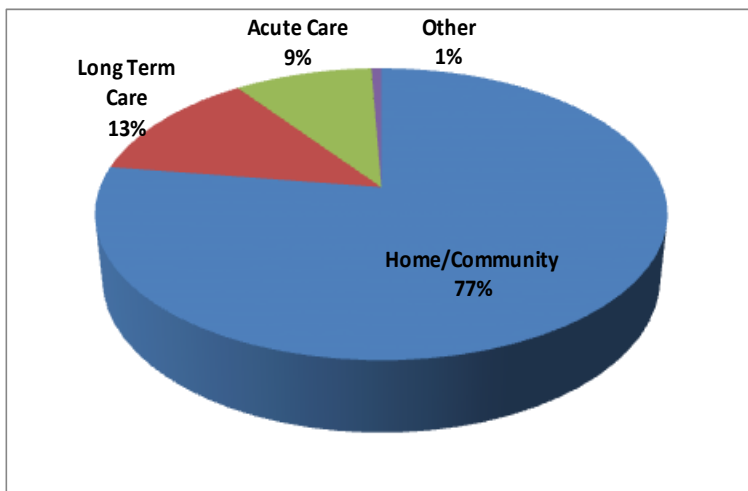

Discharge Disposition



The ability to return to home is a key outcome of the Program. WFBH's Inpatient Rehab Program discharges a higher percentage of patients to home than other rehab programs throughout the nation.

Functional Improvement

Average Functional Improvement for Patients in Our Program:

Self Care	52%
Bowel & Bladder Control	48%
Locomotion (Walking/Stairs)	82%
Bed, Toilet, & Chair Transfers	62%
Communication	19%
Interaction/Memory/Problem Solving	18%

Patients work with the care team to set functional improvement goals in the areas listed above. Improvement is defined as the change in functional scores between admission and discharge from the program.
