



Cystoscopy Home Care

General Information

Your doctor looked inside your bladder with a cystoscope. He or she may have used the cystoscope to remove stones, dilate the ureters, or take tissue samples.

Points to Remember

- You may have some burning when you pass your urine the first day.
- You may see a small amount of blood in your urine for one to two days.
- You may pass your urine more often the first day.
- You may have your usual diet.
- Drink 8 ounces (one cup) of fluid every 2 hours while awake to clear your bladder.
- Resume your normal routines the next day or as your doctor tells you.

Signs and Symptoms Call your doctor if you have:

- Fever of 101 degrees F or greater
- Bright red blood in urine
- Blood clots in urine
- Cannot pass urine
- Severe burning or pain when passing urine
