Carpenter Library News



Class Yearbooks are Now Digital

The <u>yearbooks</u> of Wake Forest School of Medicine (formerly Bowman Gray School of Medicine) and North Carolina Baptist Hospital School of Nursing are now available electronically thanks to the <u>North Carolina Digital Heritage Center</u>.

The Center's goal is to digitize "hidden" and statewide historical interest collections from institutions which do not have the staff or equipment to make them available on the Internet. The yearbook collection is one of several types of materials being digitized by staff and machines rented from the Internet Archive. The Center, funded by a grant, is housed in the Louis R. Wilson Special Collections Library at UNC Chapel Hill.

Yearbooks that were digitized include:

- Gray and White Matter (Medical and Nursing schools combined): 1945-1969
- The Lamp (Nursing school): 1943, 1944
- White Matter (Nursing school): 1970-1974
- Gray Matter (Medical school): 1970-2011 current

NLINE NOW Available

The Red Book, developed by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Committee on Infectious Diseases, provides guidance on the manifestations, etiology, epidemiology, diagnosis, and treatment of more than 200 common childhood conditions.

Special features for the electronic version include updates between print editions and breaking news related to pediatric infectious diseases or immunizations.

It is located in the Library's E-Books database and in our Catalog, Voyager.

Zotero: Collecting, Managing and Citing Reference Resources

This class is an introduction to reference management using Zotero, an open-source program. Zotero, a FREE plug-in for the Firefox web browser, allows you to collect and store references from online and print sources, add your own annotations and use your stored references to insert correct citations into a document. Zotero allows you to save web pages and articles located in Carpenter Library subscription databases such as PubMed, Web of Science and CINAHL. When you write a paper, you can utilize Zotero to integrate your references into the document in numerous citation styles. Additionally, Zotero enables you to share references when working on a collaborative project.
