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## Be Aware: Predatory Publishing

[The New York Times](#), among other publications, has reported that academic researchers are seeing an increase in predatory publishers. These “publishers” are little more than scams to cash in on the author-paid, Open Access model that is becoming more prevalent in the area of scholarly communication.

A helpful guide for evaluating the validity of publishers and journals is provided by Jeffrey Beall, a University of Colorado librarian. It may be accessed at

We are a beta test site for their new interface that incorporates several new features including two exam interfaces. In addition to the USMLE Practice exams, Exam Master Online has **Medical Subject Reviews** (anatomy, biochemistry, cytology and histology, internal and clinical medicine, medical microbiology, pathology, physiology, psychiatry), **Medical Certification** (family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery, general pediatrics, special purpose examination), **Physician Assistant** (PANCE/PANRE, clinical modules for PAs, medical subject review for PAs), **Dental Subject Review** for the NBDE Part I exam, and **Pharmacy Review** (NAPLEX).

### Service in the Library

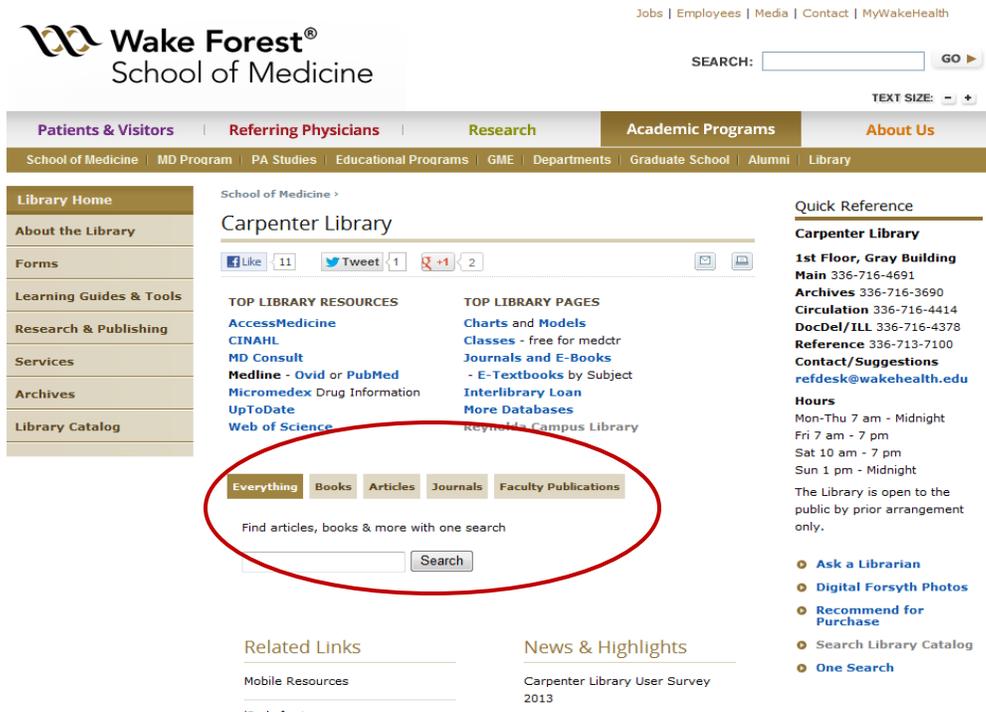
The Library offers [Notary Public](#) services during limited hours. Please call the Information Desk at 713-7100 or 716-4414 before you come to the Library to ensure that a notary will be available to assist you when you arrive.

Here are some important things to remember:

- Do not sign your document before you meet with the Notary Public.
- Please bring a photo id with you.
- Every person needing to sign must be present.
- We can only notarize documents in English. All foreign language documents must be translated into English before notarization.
- Documents are required to have a Notary Certificate on them – this is the wording about the notary signature, dates, and other information.

The new search box is convenient and comprehensive.

- Everything tab - yields books, articles, videos, models and more in all three Wake Forest Libraries.
- Books tab - find Carpenter Library ebooks and books.
- Articles tab - yields links to the full text of all Wake Forest University journal holdings.
- Journals tab - find Carpenter Library ejournals and journals.
- Faculty Publications tab – searches all Medical Center authors from 1990 to the present.

## Upcoming Changes to NIH Public Access Policy Reporting Requirements

In the spring of 2013, the NIH will delay processing of noncompeting continuation grant awards if publications arising from that award are not in compliance with the NIH Public Access policy. Beginning this spring, institutional administrators can use the Public Access Compliance Monitor to track the status of applicable publications.

The Office of Research has created a web page which has a link to all **Noncompliant and In Process** publications. <http://intranet.wakehealth.edu/Departments/Office-of-Research/Public-Access-Information.htm>

Researchers must use My NCBI's "My Bibliography" tool to manage their professional bibliographies and comply with the policy. The Carpenter Library provides support for

- Clarification of NIH Public Access compliance process (and upcoming changes)
- Publisher Policy information
- Copyright Guidance
- Creation of MyNCBI accounts with MyBibliography (and linking to eCommons)
- General Support (PMID vs PMCID, etc)

In addition, this spring the Library will offer classes which cover the basics of the policy and how to manage compliance by creating a MyBibliography linked to the eRA Commons.
