My NCBI SciENCv Web Application

SciENCv is a new feature in My NCBI that helps users create an online professional profile that can be made public to share with others. Users can document their education, employment, research activities, publications, honors, research grants, and other professional contributions. eRA Commons account holders who have linked their eRA account to My NCBI will find their SciENCv profile already in place with the information stored in their eRA Commons profile.

One nice feature of SciENCv is that an NIH Biographical Sketch can be automatically generated by the information noted in a SciENCv profile. As stated on the NIH Notice: *This new electronic system will enable researchers to easily assemble the information (including expertise, employment, education and professional accomplishments) to populate an NIH biographical sketch (biosketch). Initially, the goal of SciENCv is to reduce the burden associated with creating and maintaining federal biosketches while accommodating the need to describe scientific contributions.*

The h-index

What is it?

For decades, researchers have attempted to measure value of scientific work using an array of bibliometric tools. One of the newer ones is the h-index. Proposed in 2005 by physicist Jorge Hirsch at the University of California at San Diego, the index was created to help compare productivity of scholars in different fields.

The *h*-index reflects both the number of publications and the number of times each of these has been cited. A scientist with an index of *h* has published *N* articles, *h* of which has been cited in other papers at least *h* times. For example, 20 papers by an author that have each been cited 20 times will yield an h-index of 20.

Where do I read about it?

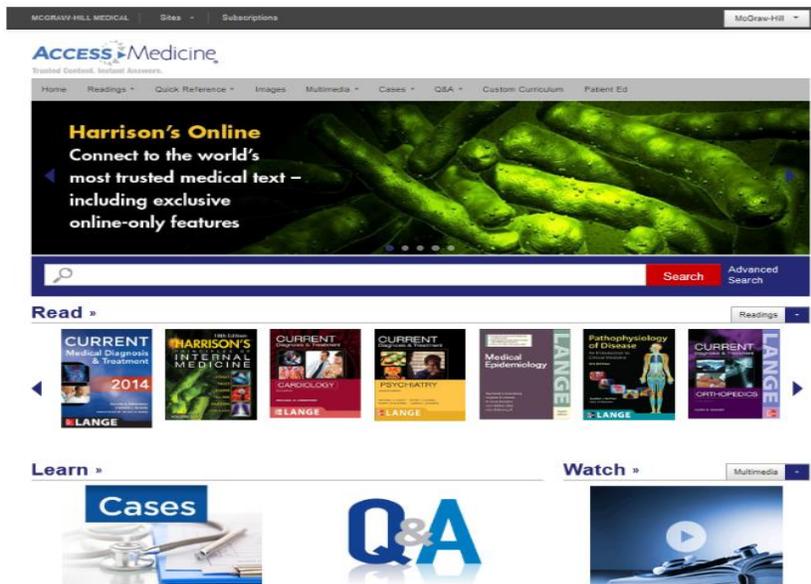

Access Medicine

The New Website



The new AccessMedicine web site is up. It offers all of the same content in a more graphically-oriented context. Chapter layouts are clear and there is less scrolling. Full text links to journal articles referenced in the chapters are available. AMA and APA citation formats are given for every chapter and one can download the citations into Zotero, EndNote, or Reference Manager formats.

It also offers more personalization: now WFBH users can set up a 'My Access' account on campus and then log on remotely by using their 'My Access' user name and password. No VPNs and no extra logins needed!

Residency Directors can create course-specific online modules using materials drawn from the textbooks and multimedia contained within AccessMedicine which their students can easily access.

New titles have been added including:

- Essentials of Clinical Geriatrics*
- Symptom to Diagnosis: an evidence-based guide*
- Systematic Musculoskeletal Examinations*
- Understanding Clinical Research*
- Understanding Teamwork in Health Care*

Notary Public

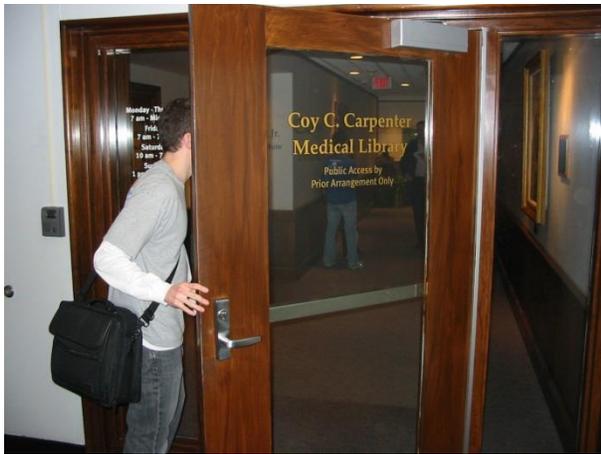
Service in the Library

The Library offers [Notary Public](#) services during limited hours. Please call the Information Desk at 713-7100 or 716-4414 before you come to the Library to ensure that a notary will be available to assist you when you arrive.

Here are some important things to remember:

- Do not sign your document before you meet with the Notary Public.
- Please bring a photo id with you.

- Every person needing to sign must be present.
- We can only notarize documents in English. All foreign language documents must be translated into English before notarization.
- Documents are required to have a Notary Certificate on them – this is the wording about the notary signature, dates, and other information.
