Carpenter Library will scan and deliver electronic copies of articles from print journals in our collection at no cost to Medical Center staff. Requesting a scanned article is similar to requesting an interlibrary loan using ILLiad. If you have not previously used ILLiad, please register at <https://wfu.illiad.oclc.org/illiad/nbg/FirstTime.html>. Thereafter, you can submit requests via [ILLiad](#) or send them to us via email at [docdel@wakehealth.edu](mailto:docdel@wakehealth.edu). We will deliver articles in PDF format to either your ILLiad or email account, depending on your preference. We offer same-day delivery on most articles unless the requested material is held at Piedmont Plaza, in which case requests received after noon will be filled the following day.

# ClinicalKey



The Carpenter Library now offers ClinicalKey. Upgraded and expanded from MD Consult, Clinical Key offers hundreds of books and journals, procedural videos illustrating over 95 medical techniques, First Consult (a clinical point-of-care resource), practice guidelines, and CME credits via the Cleveland Clinics.

Your search results are displayed in a central panel in order of clinical relevance. The left panel allows you to refine your search results by study type (systematic reviews, meta-analyses, RCTs, and narrative reviews), date, medical specialty, or content type.

- Registering for a personal login allows you to use *My ClinicalKey* to save searches, download, and print and email content to others.
- With a personal login, you can use create reading lists of downloaded content permanently available to you.
- The Presentation Maker allows you to use images from ClinicalKey in your own PowerPoint presentations.
- Physicians may earn 0.5 AMA PRA Category 1 Credit for each search conducted through ClinicalKey.

## Resources & Access for Preceptors

The library's electronic resources are expensive and cost is often determined by the size of the institution. We have agreements and protections in place that allow us to give limited access on a temporary basis to preceptors, non-employees working on a shared grant, etc.

The library asks that the department inform the library of individuals who need limited access. We will maintain a list should publishers scrutinizing our usage question us about seemingly unaffiliated users.

All classes are free, but **registration is required**.

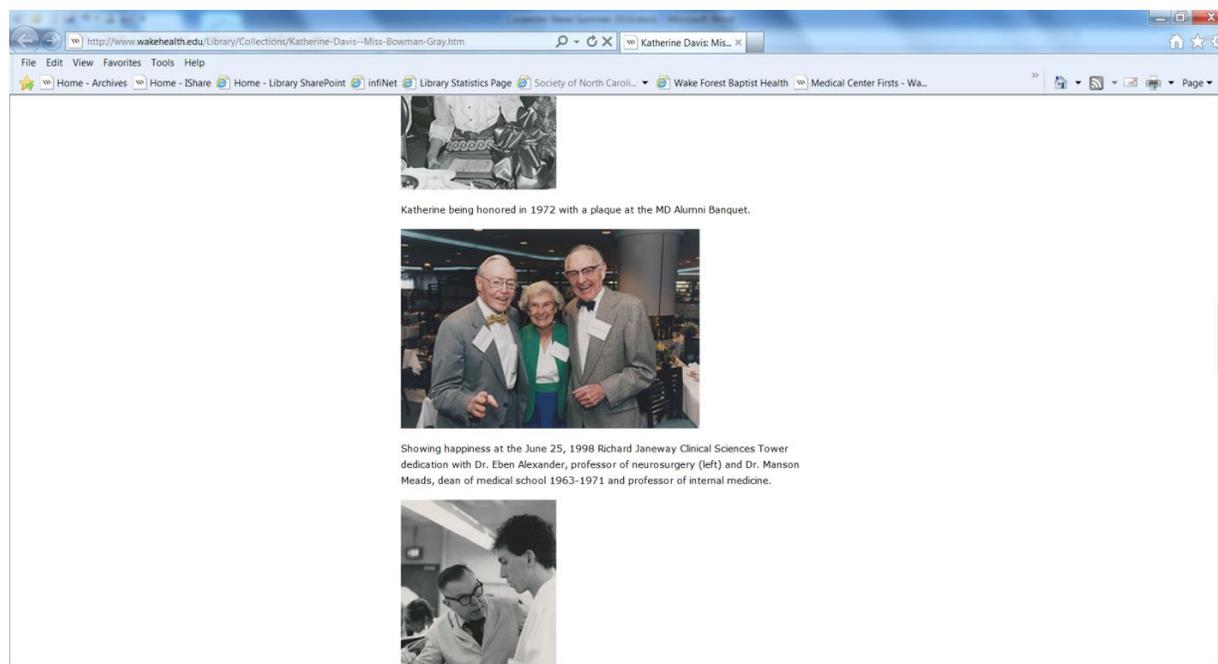

Dorothy Carpenter Medical Archives' newest online [exhibit](#) is *Katherine Davis: Miss Bowman Gray*.

She began as secretary to the registrar in 1942 and continued working, even after official retirement, until close to her time of death in early 2013. She was known for her quiet and kind demeanor. # ORCID for Researchers – Move to an Author ID

An innovative new scheme launched in October 2012 could signal the end of concerns over author ambiguity.

Academics, researchers and contributors can register for a unique ID with ORCID (the Open Researcher and Contributors ID repository). These identifiers can be used by editors, funding agencies, publishers, and institutions to reliably identify individuals in the same way that ISBNs and DOIs identify books and articles.

To register, researchers should visit the [ORCID website](#), where they can create a complete online record of their research and publications. This is made open and freely available via a web page and data feeds. More importantly, once created, a researcher's unique ORCID can be used as a linking identifier throughout the entire chain of the scholarly communication process to allow reliable attribution of research.

ORCID is freely available to individuals and has an easy-to-use application programming interface (API) to encourage integration with existing systems, development of new tools, and to inspire novel uses of the repository data. The advantages of the new ORCID are numerous:

- **Editors** will have a one-stop shop for reviewing a contributor's history and can gain an oversight of an author's work to date, as well as their professional relationships.
- **Researchers** will avoid having to enter biographical and bibliographic data in multiple systems.
- **Institutions and funding bodies** will benefit from easier, more reliable analysis of scholarly output.
- **Publishers** will enjoy a simplified publication workflow and greater opportunities for product and service development.
